Paula C. Johnson is professor of law at Syracuse University College of Law. Professor Johnson and Professor Janis McDonald co-direct the Cold Case Justice Initiative (CCJI) at Syracuse University College of Law, which investigates racially-motivated murders committed during the civil rights era. She has held several distinguished teaching posts, including the Haywood Burns Chair in Civil Rights at CUNY Law School in 2005-2006 and the Syracuse University College of Law Bond, Schoeneck and King Distinguished Professorship from 2004-2006. She was copresident of the Society of American Law Teachers (SALT), a national organization of approx. 900 law professors from 2002-2003. She earned her B.A. from the University of Maryland, College Park; her J.D. from Temple University School of Law; and her LL.M. from Georgetown University Law Center. Her scholarship and activism focus on matters of race, gender, sexuality, criminal law, international human rights, diversity and access to higher education in academic arenas, local and national media, and grassroots forums. She is co-editor of Interrupted Life: Experiences of Incarcerated Women in the United States (Univ. Calif. Press 2010); and is the author of Inner Lives: Voices of African American Women in Prison (NYU Press, 2003).

She has received the Syracuse University Chancellor's Citation for Excellence, and the Unsung Heroine Award from the Syracuse University Martin Luther King, Jr. Awards Committee. Professor Johnson is also a photographer.
