Harding is the editor or author of 12 books, including *The Science Question in Feminism* (1986), *Whose Science? Whose Knowledge?* (1991), *Is Science Multicultural?* (1998), *Science and Social Inequality* (2006), *Sciences From Below: Feminisms, Postcolonialities, and Modernities* (2008) and *The Postcolonial Science and Technology Studies Reader* (2011). She was the coeditor (with Kathryn Norberg) of *Signs: Journal of Women in Culture and Society* from 2000 to 2005. She has also served as a consultant on epistemology and philosophy of science issues for several UN organizations, including the Pan American Health Organization; the United Nations Educational, Scientific, and Cultural Organization (UNESCO); the UN Development Fund for Women (UNIFEM); and the UN Commission on Science and Technology for Development.
